Introduction for Deputy Principal of Te Kura o Te Mahoe – Whaea Roimata

E ngā mana, e ngā reo, e ngā karangatanga maha o te wā, tēnei te mihi ki a koutou katoa. He hōnore nui tēnei ki te tuku kupu whakatau i tō tātou Tumuaki Tuarua hou o Te Kura o Te Mahoe – arā, ko Whaea Roimata.

Whaea Roimata is a product of kaupapa Māori education, beginning her journey at Tūmanako Kōhanga Reo before pursuing higher learning at the University of Waikato, where she earned a Postgraduate Diploma in Teaching and Learning. Her love for Māori arts and culture is evident in her academic achievements, including a Bachelor's degree in Māori Performing Arts from Te Whare Wānanga o Awanuiārangī and a Diploma in Animation (Level 5)

from Yoobee Colleges. She also strengthened her fluency in te reo Māori by completing a Diploma in Rumaki Reo – Te Aupikitanga (Level 6) at Te Wānanga o Aotearoa. Her passion for education is not just academic—it extends into her career. In 2022, she began teaching as a Kaiāwhina (teaching assistant) at Te Kura o Noera – Newton School in Hamilton. In 2023, holding a Limited Authority to Teach (L.A.T) certification, she took on roles as a Teacher Release and



Rumaki Reo Māori Administrator at Te Kura o Motueka – Allandale School. From 2023 to 2024, she became the Kaiako for Ngā Teina at Te Kura o Tāneatua, where she also carried responsibilities as Deputy Principal Release. Whaea Roimata has a deep love for Ngā Mahi a Toi (Visual Arts) and Kapa Haka—two passions that she brings into her teaching and leadership. With the endorsement of our Tumuaki and the approval of the Te Kura o Te Mahoe Board of Trustees, she now steps into the role of Deputy Principal.
