Summary of the Education Review Office (ERO) Visit

Overview

The recent ERO visit to Te Kura o Te Mahoe assessed both the Rumaki Māori Medium and Aunoa Mainstream, identifying strengths and areas needing improvement in compliance, governance, and student achievement.



The review will focus on:

- Teaching Quality
- Regulatory Compliance
- Strategic Leadership, and
- Student well-being.

To address these areas, the school will focus on:

- Policy updates
- Curriculum development
- Leadership strengthening, and
- Student-centered approaches.

The next steps involve working with the Board of Trustees to implement necessary changes and ensure compliance with Ministry of Education regulations, ultimately enhancing student success.

A Whānau Hui was held last Wednesday 5th March

ERO was on hand to listen to the feedback from whānau, parents and the community as a whole.

With a small turnout of parents. However, those who attended shared positive feedback about the improvements in their children's demeanour and behaviour at home.
